



FWSA CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA

1976

The Championship Regatta is the first of two regattas sponsored each year by the Florida Women's Sailing Association (FWSA). It is held in crewed boats.

On September 14, 1976, John M. Bangston executed a Deed of Gift and Trust Agreement providing a perpetual trophy to be known as the Bangston Trophy. This was done to perpetuate an annual Championship Regatta for FWSA Member Clubs in a three person, one design yacht for the purpose of promoting women in sailing. For a few years it was difficult for find suitable one design boats, resulting in cancellation of the regatta. To alleviate this problem, an Amendment to the Deed of Gift and Trust was executed on January 27, 1993 providing that: "Should it become impractical to hold the event in a three person boat, any suitable one-design class of sailboat may be used."

In the recent past we have had Spinnaker and Non-spinnaker teams competing. The Bankston Trophy has been awarded to the winning team in the Spinnaker division. In 2005, The Board of Directors voted to add a new trophy donated to FWSA to be awarded to the winning team of the Non-Spinnaker division. The winners of this trophy will be listed from year 2005 onwards.
